THE CONGRESS'S TOPICS

This Congress aims at furthering the development of an adequate philosophical understanding of the most recent evolutionary stages of world history, and especially of the self-consciousness achieved by them in contemporary theoretical ethics, political philosophy and historiography. Some of the most fundamental constitutive elements of such an understanding are certainly the foundation and the systematic development of Ethical Theory, the unfolding of the internal relation between Ethics and Politics, the factual acknowledgement of the end of the so-called “Age of Globalization”, the historical-philosophical implications of such an event, and the comprehension of the role which in this context is played by the self-definition of the Russian State as a “global power” and by its foundation through the interpretation and the critique of Hegel’s speculative idealism worked out by the best known Russian philosophers of the 20th and 21st centuries. As a consequence, many of the papers that will be presented at this Congress will focus on the complex theoretical structure of the Hegelian system, with the aim not only of reconstructing its substantial content, but also of ascertaining the degree of its objective validity and persistent up-to-dateness in contemporary philosophy.

The Congress’s programme foresees the publication of its Proceedings in a book, which the publisher Aracne Editrice has already agreed to print in one of its philosophical collections.

The Congress’s official languages are Italian, German and English.
